

The Fish Pathologist is competent to conduct fish health inspections, process samples, perform or supervise laboratory work, and interpret in-house results, as well as those from specialized reference laboratories. The Fish Pathologist is also capable of providing responsible recommendations and/or prescriptions (licensed veterinarians only) for control measures for fish diseases within legal constraints.

Technical skills, experience, and high ethical standards enable the Fish Pathologist to serve fisheries programs and aquaculture through the evaluation and diagnosis of fish health problems, through responsible recommendations for disease control, and through the administration of programs designed to enhance the health of cultured and free-ranging aquatic animals.

You are asked to address three items on the applicant's behalf as shown below. It is understood that you may not have direct knowledge of the applicant's entire professional career. With this in mind, please answer these questions to the best of your knowledge, being as specific and complete as possible. If additional space is required, please use additional pages referencing these according to the questions being answered.

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1. **Current work status:** Describe the applicant's current professional work; include the specific activities related to aquatic animal health and state what percentage of his/her total work time is spent in aquatic animal health activities. If you are the applicant's supervisor and/or employer, you may enter his/her position description, if appropriate.

2. **Previous professional work experience:** Describe what you know about the applicant's professional fish health work experience. For each position, give approximate dates and the percentage of the total time spent in fish health activities, which may include (1) disease diagnostics and control; (2) fish disease/health research; (3) fish disease/health instruction at the university level or its equivalent; or (4) administrative work directly related to fish disease diagnostics and control.
