Editorial: The instructions to authors will be revised next year to follow only AFS guidelines. Gary Matlock and Gary Garrett were asked to serve the rest of the year to help select papers.

Publicity Committee: We discussed selling the old Proceedings at a package deal at 25-30% discount. We also discussed donating the old proceedings to schools with major fishery programs. Jimmy Dean has compiled a list of these schools. Currently the proceedings are just gathering dust and taking up space. We have only sold 17 of them since November 1980. By giving them to appropriate libraries we will at least get a little publicity.

President's Report:

- 1. The parent society requested a list of our members that are not parent society members. It was brought to our attention that our bylaws state that to be a voting member of the Texas Chapter, one must be a member of the parent society. Gary replied to the parent society that we will make an effort to campaign for parent society membership but that the parent society should do some self analysis of reasons why membership is down, such as:
 - a. cost of membership
 - b. cost of publications
- c. perception that you don't really get anything for the dues if you don't take transactions.
- 2. The parent society wants a display from the Texas chapter for the annual meeting. Jimmy Dean and Maury Ferguson will put together a notebook.
- 3. We decided to send \$25.00 to the capital fund committee for the building fund.

<u>Secretary-Treasurer's Report:</u> Membership this year is up to 154. Congratulations to Don Whitmore - that is the highest ever. There are still a lot of fisheries people out there who aren't members - everyone should do their part to encourage them to join.

News from the National:

The Texas Chapter stocking guide got a very nice mention in the AFS Fisheries Management Section Newsletter:

'Stocking-Management Guide Available: The Texas Chapter of the AFS has produced a very good guide to the stocking and management of farm ponds in Texas that will be applicable to several states. The publication titled, "Stocking and Management Recommendations for Texas Ponds,' is directed toward stocking and harvest recommendations for warm water ponds less than 5 acres. Whereas most stocking recommendations simply recommend species and number of fish per acre, the above publication provides a key matching environmental conditions with species recommendations. For information concerning a copy of the publication contact a member of the Texas Chapter.'
