Texas Chapter Annual Meeting 10/14/91

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 a.m. Secretary-treasurer, Barbara Gregg certified that a quorum of the membership was present. Committee reports were requested by Gene McCarty, President.

<u>Secretary-Treasurer - Barbara Gregg:</u> \$4173.45 in checking (\$1000 of this amount from t-shirts); \$3265.20 in 2 Certificates of Deposit. Move to accept report by Clark Hubbs, second by Nick Parker

<u>Publicity - Roy Kleinsasser:</u> Although Roy was not present, his report indicated that news releases were provided to AFS (for Fisheries) and to Southern Division for new officers and award winners after last year's meeting. Information concerning the \$1,000 in scholarship funds provided by Wetlands Habitat Alliance of Texas for fisheries students was provided to outdoor writers around the state.

The Fisheries Workers Directory is in final stages of completion and should be ready to print by the end of the year.

<u>Pond Management - Hal Schramm/Billy Higginbotham:</u> Information indicating that the committee is continuing to add private pond owners to the database established several years ago was presented by Bobby Farquhar.

Editorial - Dick Luebke: Proceedings from last year's annual meeting have been completed and sent to Bob Kendall for approval and assignment of ISSN Number. Beginning with this issue, the proceedings will be considered an official publication of the AFS. Member copies will be mailed out soon. The TPWD Austin office will be used as semi-permanent mailing address for AFS purposes. Presenters are being encouraged to publish their papers in the proceedings, rather than only abstracts.

<u>Exhibits - Bruce Hysmith:</u> Special thanks to John Moczygemba and John Ballard who were committee members. Sent out 120 letters requesting donations and received a few items. Collections are less than usual because of the national meeting.

<u>Issues - Victor Palma:</u> Statements expressing the Chapter's position on issues associated with the Brazoria National Wildlife Preserve and the building of the Dangerfield Canal were written to the various authorities overseeing public comment on these two projects.

<u>Newsletter - Pat Hutson:</u> Four issues of the newsletter were printed this year. An additional accomplishment was to collect back issue for a bound copy of all newsletters.

<u>Endowments - Gary Valentine:</u> In Gary's absence, Dave Terre reported that there were a number of very well qualified students recommended for receipt of a Texas Chapter scholarship this year. With the funding received from WHAT, two \$500 scholarships will be awarded this year.

<u>Membership - Loraine Fries:</u> Membership for 1991 was 160. To date 105 members are registered for 1992.

Move to accept reports by Clark Hubbs, second by Nick Parker.

President Gene McCarty thanked all members for their participation and support of the annual AFS meeting in San Antonio. He indicated that AFS will be making a substantial contribution to the scholarship fund (between \$5,000 and \$10,000) because of the chapter's work in San Antonio. After the gavel was passed from Gene to incoming president Bill Provine, Gene was presented a past-president's plaque. Bill Provine indicated that his primary goal for next year will be the creation of a brochure describing how to develop an urban and children's fishing program.

# New business:

Phil Durocher solicited input from this group concerning changes in the rules on grass carp in Texas. The Freshwater Fisheries Advisory Board which contains three chapter members met and discussed this issue. The group is in agreement with TPWD staff

(many of whom are also chapter members) who want to recommend triploid grass carp for vegetation control in private water, except in areas that contain endangered and threatened species.

Dick Luebke moved that the Issues Committee of the chapter make a statement to Parks and Wildlife Commission regarding grass carp before the November commission meeting.

Motion accepted with one nay

In additional discussion, Clark Hubbs pointed out that action must be quick. More discussion indicated that a coastal person should be added to the issues committee. Volunteers were solicited to be on an ad hoc committee to draft letter to commission on grass carp. Committee appointed was Mark Webb, Earl Chilton, Bryan Murphy, Paul Hammerschmidt, Bruce Hysmith, Rick Ott, Clark Hubbs, Mac McCune.

Roger McCabe suggested a committee be appointed to develop an urban fishing brochure. Phil Durocher made the motion made that the chapter support the concept of developing an urban fishing brochure. (The president is already empowered to create the committee.) Unanimous yes vote. President can then appoint the working committee.

Meeting adjourned at 10:15.

Bob Kendall called and said that the Texas Chapter Proceedings have been approved and the assignment of an ISSN number will arrive shortly. At that time, the Proceedings can be published.

## THE AMERICAN FISHERIES SOCIETY AWARD OF EXCELLENCE

## September 27, 1989

The American Fisheries Society initiated the Award of Excellence in 1969. A list of the recipients is to be found on the attached page.

- PURPOSE of the Award is to recognize outstanding scientists in the field of fisheries and aquatic biology.
- NATURE of the Award a bronze medal with appropriate design and inscription, a certificate in a walnut plaque, and travel and related expenses up to \$1,000 for the recipient to attend the meeting to receive the award.

#### CRITERIA for selection of the Award:

- 1. A monumental work
- 2. Original techniques or research methodology
- 3. New, fresh ideas, viewpoints, or data which contribute remarkably to conservation management, or basic understanding of aquatic resources
- 4. A new, successfully executed fishery research or management program of national or international importance
- 5. Imaginative and successful programs in fish conservation education at any level of teaching, or graduate student guidance
- 6. Important faunal or ecological discoveries or new taxonomic criteria
- 7. Research especially beneficial to mankind
- 8. Interdisciplinary research involving leadership in team efforts in laboratory or field
- 9. Multiple, successful efforts in a variety of fields, such as biology, public understanding, technical and popular writing, laboratory and field research, inspirational leadership, and/or enunciation of principles

#### SPECIFICATIONS AND LIMITATIONS

- 1. An award recipient must be living at time of selection
- 2. The award will not necessarily be made annually, but will be made only in such years there is substantial or unanimous agreement among members of the Award Committee that an award is justified.
